===> Meet the New ASEC Digital – Aaron Conway, KK4EHJ

Aaron Conaway, KK4EHJ, pursued his Technician license in September of 2011 after seeing a video on YouTube showing how ham radio saved so many lives during the Haiti Earthquake. He upgraded to General in March of 2012, and Amateur Extra in September of that same year.

By trade, Aaron designs and builds computer networks around the world. He's a high-end Cisco and Juniper guy who spends most of his time making packets go back and forth. It's a high-tech job that pairs very well with ham radio and gives him a solid understanding of the digital modes. Aaron is currently working on a packet radio project using Raspberry Pis. The new project will enable lower-cost deployments of APRS and Winlink nodes using available hardware and software.

Aaron is a member of both the Gateway Amateur Radio Club in Cleveland, GA, and the North Georgia Amateur Radio Club in Dahlonega where he currently serves as Vice President. He is ARES and Skywarn certified, and volunteers with area public service events.

===> Georgia ARES Graphical Repeater Database Project

Efforts continue in the development of the Georgia ARES Repeater Mapping Initiative. Brian Haren, W8BYH, has been continuing to tweak and make improvements to the GIS database. One of the key objectives is to provide a web map interface for ARES to accurately identify repeater systems in Georgia that are available for emergency communications. This is particularly useful for events that are unexpected or range over an area in an unpredictable manner such as hurricanes and some weather events. Emergency Coordinators are encouraged to provide information for repeater(s) in their respective areas that are available for ARES use. Other repeaters can also be included in the initiative but will not be listed as ARES repeaters. This repeater information will also be made available in a wide variety of text formats (.csv, .txt, PDF) via the Georgia ARES website. If you have repeater information that you think will be useful to have graphically mapped in this online geographical system, visit https://sites.google.com/w8byh.org/gaares-repeater-database-init/. ===> Has your club tried a Skills Day yet?

Similar to how the classes were offered at the state ARES meeting, a Skills Day relies on the Elmers in your club to teach a skill they are experts in to small groups. Skills Day is not necessarily an ARES event, even though all the skills that can be taught relate to ARES operation. Keep it fun for everyone in the club!

We now hold Skill Days regularly at the North Georgia Amateur Radio Club. We have had classes on everything from soldering, antenna building, and installing Anderson power poles, to serving as Net Control for our club's weekly net, operating on solar power, and using Winlink. Our next Skills Day will include a Buddy Pole challenge commercial versus home brew. We're going to rate the two antennas on things like ease of transport and set-up as well as seeing how many QSOs we can make with each.

Feed them and they will come! Options for food include ordering pizza, barbecue catering, or covered dish. Trust me, serving food is important as people are more likely to attend events with food.

After the food, your classes can be scheduled two ways. All the attendees can move through every class one after the other. This takes time if you offer several classes, and you may see people leaving before all the classes are done.

We scheduled three classes to run at the same time and had attendees register for the class they wanted to take during each schedule slot. This worked quite well, and people who missed a class at the last picnic will be able to pick it up when we do it again.
